ACTIVITIES FOR 2021

Medical Interventions

1. Save-a-Sight Campaign - Partnership with Premium Pension Limited. Two hundred indigent patients have benefited from free eye cataract surgery sponsored by Premium Pension Limited, in partnership with a Charity to Cheer Foundation, a non-governmental organization.

The surgery was conducted in two batches at Gambo Sawaba Hospital in Zaria, Kaduna State, on March 6 and June 6 this year, according to a statement by the company's spokesperson, Aliyu Mohammed Aliyu on Thursday.

In his remarks, Emir of Zazzau Ahmed Nuhu Bamalli, commended Premium Pension Limited for sponsoring the operations. He acknowledged the effort of the company's Chief Executive Officer Mr. Umar Sanda Mairami, on the commitment, dedication and support he extended to Charity to Cheer Foundation in achieving this laudable initiative aimed at reducing hardship to the less privileged in the society.

In his goodwill message, Mr Mairami, said the sponsorship was parts of the company's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) interventions, aimed at touching the lives of people at locations nationwide. He said CSR "is an integral part of the company's corporate governance architecture for which we have won awards and it is a deliberate policy of the company, as a responsible corporate entity, to help people in need and contribute to the development of the society."

The president of foundation Dr. Maryam Shehu Mohammed, commended the company for sponsoring the project without any hesitation. She said the beneficiaries were mostly senior citizens, who could not afford the cost of the surgery at a health facility.

DONATION OF SCHOOL TO KOFAR YAMMA COMMUNITY

A nursery and primary school initiated to target pupils in need of secular and Islamic education in Dambatta and its environs. The idea behind setting it up is to close the immense deficit in educational gaps within the state, while focusing on improving and providing qualitative education that can compete, anywhere in the country.

The school has a capacity of 15 classrooms (40 pupils max) per classroom, fully equipped with a large staffroom, principal/ secretary's office, sanitary facilities for students and teachers separated, a functional borehole and sufficient solar powered lighting around the school premises.

The school will be taking off with 5 fully completed classrooms and a staff room, while all the other classrooms shall be delivered in phases over time.

The school is located at Kofar Yamma, Dambatta Town. Admission into nursery & primary 1 is ongoing as the academics session is scheduled to commence in the coming week.

The idea of setting up the school was that of our late father Mallam Magaji Dambatta who did not live to see through the Project. It was then taken up by his children who built the classes and handed them over to Islamic Foundation to run the school

There were also contributions made by family and friends and even anonymous donors.
